

1. CAMP DATES . . .

PLEASE CHOOSE A DATE WHEN THE CAMPER CAN BE HERE FOR THE ENTIRE SESSION WITHOUT INTERRUPTION. CAMPERS THAT LEAVE CAMP EARLY WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO RETURN TO THE CAMP SESSION.

(Thanks for no weekend calls or home calls—we can't do it without our books anyway.)

2. REGISTRATION . . .

Registration will begin Monday afternoon at 3:00 p.m. (Counselors are in staff meeting and no supervision is available prior to this time, so please do not arrive early.) Camp ends on Saturday at 12:30 p.m. — Please do not be late. (Campers feel anxious when everyone else is gone and they are left. It is not a good way to end a wonderful week.) Parents are welcome to attend the closing ceremony which begins at 12:00 noon on Saturday. Please don't plan on leaving early.

THE COST . . . \$500, of which \$200 is required as a registration fee. Remaining \$300 paid on arrival. Please help us by ONLY sending the required deposit or the FULL amount with your signed application. This will help registration run smoothly on Monday . . . the lines can get long! It is important to us that you understand our refund policy so that you do not feel we are trying to take advantage of you. Also, we cannot accommodate campers over the weekend between sessions. Our counselors have to rest; there are no exceptions.

3. REFUND POLICY . . . Prior to May 1st half of the registration fee will be refunded. Immediately after May 1st there will be no refunds. There will be no exceptions

4. CAMPER SHOULD BRING . . . Sleeping bag (or blankets and sheets), clip-on fan, tennis shoes, shorts, shirts, socks, stamps, stationery, hat (if skin difficulty from the sun), camera (if desired), Bible, towel, wash cloths, and toilet articles. Campers should bring extra money for T-shirts, canteen, etc. A general suggestion is between \$35 to \$40. Bills can be exchanged for quarters and/or smaller bills at registration on Monday. GIRLS — ONE PIECE BATHING SUITS ONLY. NO RADIOS, IPODS, VIDEO GAMES, VIDEO CAMERAS, FIREWORKS, LIGHTERS, OR MATCHES ARE ALLOWED. ABSOLUTELY NO CELL PHONES ARE ALLOWED AT CAMP — CAMPERS USING CELL PHONES WILL BE DISMISSED FROM CAMP. This is imperative to insure your camper's safety. It would be impossible to monitor the phone calls received and made at camp without STRICTLY enforcing this policy.

5. CAMP POLICIES . . . No body piercing (girls with earrings are an exception). No smoking, matches, lighters, drugs, alcohol, or tobacco of any form is allowed. One First-Aid Counselor is available — there is no nurse or physician on staff.

6. VISITING . . . Because of short sessions, parents and friends are not allowed to visit during camp, and phone calls are restricted to emergency calls only.

7. FOOD . . . Brookhill furnishes a variety of nutritious foods. Meals are furnished in the total cost. Brookhill leaves cold drinks and snacks up to parents' discretion, and young people will have regularly scheduled canteen time to safeguard proper eating habits (bring extra money for these things). SORRY, NO SPECIAL DIETS FOR INDIVIDUAL NEEDS.

8. BUNK HOUSES . . . Neat, rustic, well-kept bunk houses are provided in true ranch style. Twenty campers with a Head Counselor of college age and a Jr. Counselor live in each bunk house. Girls and boys sections are adequately separated. Neat shower houses with rest room facilities are cleaned and inspected daily. Bunk house living is "family style" with a variety of different age groupings. No child of one age group is ever in bunk houses alone (providing others of the same age have registered). We will not place a group of more than three campers together as bunkmates in the same bunk house; this makes it very difficult for the counselors. Please help us avoid confusion and disappointment at registration by noting this policy when choosing bunkmates.

9. RESPONSIBILITY . . . Every conceivable effort is made to protect campers' health and safety through training of staff; however, the camp assumes no responsibility for accidents, for illness, for loss of life, nor for loss of personal equipment by fire, theft, or a camper's carelessness. Brookhill is noted for its safety measures and very few accidents. (If your child has a physical or mental condition apart from the norm, we must be contacted prior to acceptance of application.)

10. FACTS . . . Brookhill Ranch is a 520-acre camp, recreation area, and cattle ranch, all owned and operated by Don and Hettie Lue Brooks and their family. This is the camp's 46th year and young people (boys and girls) who have COMPLETED the 3rd through 9th grades are invited to take part. Located 12 miles from Hot Springs, Arkansas, off of Highway 7 North on Brookhill Ranch Road, this beautiful hill and valley land offers unlimited possibilities for outdoor adventure.

11. AIRPLANE ARRIVALS . . . We do not pick up campers outside the Hot Springs area; however, an airport shuttle service can be secured by calling 1-800-643-1505. The shuttle service comes to the Arlington Hotel in Hot Springs. Notify us a week in advance, and we'll pick up the camper there. Private planes coming into the Hot Springs airport need to notify us a week prior to arrival for pickup transportation to camp.

12. SPECIAL ATTENTION . . . The registration form MUST BE SIGNED BY A PARENT OR GUARDIAN before a camper's registration will be confirmed. We reserve the right to deny acceptance to any applicant based on the standards outlined in this application, as well as dismissal from camp should it become necessary.

13. HEALTH FORM . . . Remember to fill out the health form and bring it with you when you come to camp (DO NOT send it in with the registration).

14. PLEASE BE SURE ALL BELONGINGS ARE PROPERLY MARKED . . .

Lost items will be held for 2 weeks. Any unclaimed articles will be donated to local charitable organizations. We are sure you understand that we cannot return items left by campers. This would be impossible.

15. CAMP DEPARTURE . . . When camp is over we will have items available for sale such as T-shirts, pictures, camp DVDs, books, etc.

16. BELIEF STATEMENT . . . We believe that the Bible is the foundation for living a successful Christian life. We endeavor to teach a Biblical world view that encompasses ALL of scripture.
